
Quarterly News

Ahoy all, and thank you for your support of the October 23–28 visit to North Carolina by Commander Matt Lewis USN and members of his SSN 777 crew. The purpose of their visit was to strengthen the ties with the 777's namesake state, speak about the capabilities of a modern nuclear-powered submarine and share their experiences at sea.

Mission accomplished as the Captain and crew met with NC representatives, members of the public, prospective submarine officers from the Piedmont NROTC Consortium, STEM Ed high school students, and the local media. In Wilmington, tribute was paid to the Battleship North Carolina, sea-stories were shared at a bbq luncheon hosted by the local SubVets chapter, and a visit to Kids Making It allowed the crew to see first-hand how the "Time Aboard" teak plaques are created.

The 777 enjoyed a comprehensive behind-the-scenes tour of the Battleship North Carolina's weapons, propulsion, damage-control compartments, berthing spaces and mess decks. Kim Sincox, BB 55's historian and 777 archivist, shared artifacts from the 3 previous USS North Carolinas, including the 1832 oil painting of the ship of the line North Carolina (above).

Following the tour of the Battleship, the CO and crew enjoyed a bbq lunch hosted by the local chapter of SubVets (top right). They also visited Kids Making It (bottom right), a nonprofit youth program that helps create the teak plaques given to each departing 777 crew member as a token of appreciation of service aboard the sub.
